

CLP records biggest purchase of Renewable Energy Certificates as Rosewood Hong Kong signs six-year agreement



In response to the global climate change, CLP is committed to promoting the long-term development of renewable energy in Hong Kong, with decarbonisation being one of its priorities. Since it was launched in 2019, CLP's Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) programme has garnered strong support from the city's business enterprises. As of end-December 2020, 8.6 gigawatt hours (GWh) of electricity from renewable energy sources were purchased through the programme – a total equivalent to around 3,500 tonnes in carbon emissions reduction associated with electricity¹. Recently, CLP recorded its biggest purchase of RECs by Rosewood Hong Kong.

Rosewood Hong Kong has committed to buy 13 GWh of renewable energy for six years from the year 2020 through the REC –equivalent to around 4,800 tonnes in carbon emissions reduction associated with electricity² and around 208,000 trees planted. The Renewable Energy Collaboration Ceremony between CLP and Rosewood Hong Kong was held on 29 March 2021, signifying the full support of their sustainability pledge.

The collaboration between the two parties marks an important milestone and underlines their dedication to decarbonisation, as well as their support for renewable energy development. CLP Power Senior Director of Customer and Business Development, Ms Lena Low further emphasised CLP Power’s commitment to promoting long-term renewable energy development in Hong Kong as part of the Hong Kong SAR Government’s goal of carbon neutrality by 2050. “RECs are an effective way for businesses to contribute towards the development of renewable energy in Hong Kong, and our customers have responded enthusiastically to the programme,” she said. “I am pleased about our collaboration with Rosewood Hong Kong and hope that this sets an example in the industry motivating more organisations to join the programme and become green, low-carbon enterprises.”

Rosewood Hong Kong Regional Vice President and Managing Director Mr Hoss Vetry said, “Sustainable development is an integral part of Rosewood Hotel Group’s business. In the future, we hope to continue working closely with CLP to implement more environmental protection policies and carbon reduction projects. We fully support the development of local green energy.”

CLP’s RECs fulfil international environmental requirements and are an effective way for enterprises to support renewable energy development. We hope that businesses will actively seek CLP’s renewable energy solutions in embracing their social responsibility to lead Hong Kong towards a smart green future together.
